Dahlia definitions - Classifications are diameter size

Formal, Informal and Semi – Decorative Dahlias
Cactus, Semi-cactus, Fimbriated and Exhibition Dahlias

- GIANT: Over 260mm
- LARGE: Not less than 210mm or more than 260mm
- MEDIUM: Not less than 160mm or more than 210mm
- SMALL: Not less than 120mm or more than 160mm
- MINIATURE: Under 120mm

WATERLILY, COLLERETTE, ANEMONE, STELLAR ORCHID, PEONY, SINGLE:
Under 160mm

- SMALL BALL: 120mm – 160mm
- MINIATURE BALL: Under 120mm
- POMPON: Under 50mm
